Provided an image, we mistakenly recognize someone or something, or are simply confused. See simulacra site (2). According to Wikipedia, the term **illusory motion**, also known as **motion illusion**, is an optical illusion in which a static image appears to be moving due to the cognitive effects of interacting color contrasts and shape position. We are always vulnerable against such illusions. AI (machine learning) system is also confused with images (3). Adversarial attacks are striking not only for humans but also for AI. A variety of sensors are vulnerable against adversarial attacks. Latest autonomous cars can be fooled by spoofing GPS (Global Positioning System) sensors, LiDAR (Light Detection and Ranging) sensors, and cameras (4).
